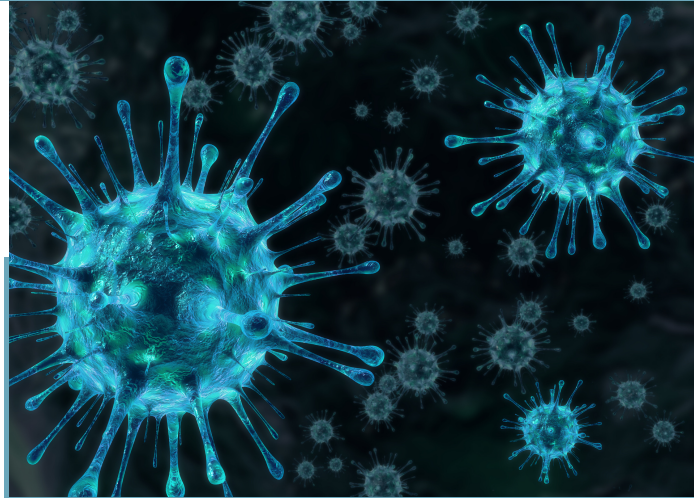

PHOENIX PROJECT SUMMARY & ACHIEVEMENTS

Phoenix Project Lead, Judith Hall, is a Professor in the School of Medicine in Cardiff University.

She has been involved in many projects in sub-Saharan Africa, mostly medical and nurse education in countries including Zambia, Liberia & Benin with UK Charity Mothers of Africa. Successful projects over 15-years include:

- Nurse Anaesthesia Curriculum in Liberia;
- Out-patient process redesign Chongwe in Zambia;
- Education support for opening of operating theatres (Chongwe, Zambia);
- Development of Clinical Officer Anaesthesia programme in Benin;
- Building schools in Zambia;
- Development & implementation of MMedAnaes programme in Namibia.

Since inception in 2014, Phoenix has led over 40 different projects. In 2017, Phoenix reached out to the University of Zambia & started research following the award of an Erasmus International Credit Mobility grant with many exchanges between Namibia, Zambia & Wales.

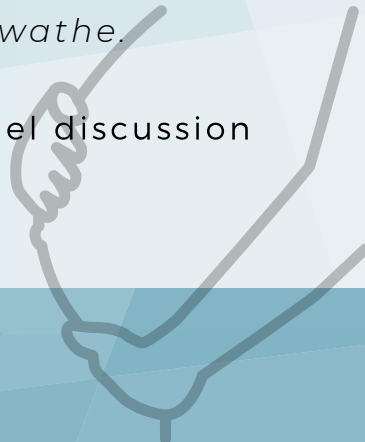

Namibia's High Commissioner HE Linda Scott

Her very first diplomatic posting was to the UK in 1990, following independence, when, together with Mr Taapopi, she opened the High Commission. She returned to London in 2018 as High Commissioner.

Growing up in Windhoek, Namibia, Ms Scott was actively involved in church-based anti-apartheid activities & later joined the Namibian National Student Organisation.

Completing her Bachelors & Honours degrees in Social Science & African Studies at the University of Cape Town, she returned to Namibia to teach English. She later obtained a Masters in Governance & Political Transformation from the University of the Free State in South Africa.

Immediately after independence she joined the Foreign Ministry & has spent 30 years in the diplomatic service. High Commissioner Scott has served as First Secretary in Cuba, Sweden, Belgium & Botswana, and Counsellor in Nigeria & Ethiopia. She served as Personal Assistant to the then Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs, and was also the Rapporteur for the 1995 Beijing Conference on Women.

When posted to the Ministry of International Relations and Cooperation, her positions included Desk Officer for several countries, Deputy Director for Southern Africa (2007-2009) and Director in the Department of Multilateral Relations & Cooperation (2014-2016). In 2016, Linda Scott took up the position of Deputy Permanent Representative at the Namibian Permanent Mission to the United Nations, New York.

Having presented her credentials to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in May 2019, High Commissioner Scott has been concurrently accredited as High Commissioner to Malta, & Ambassador to Greece & Ireland.
